Drought Update

Quabbin Levels Still "Normal" But Important to Conserve

The lone highlight of last week's Drought Monitor report is "for the first time since May, the scope of the drought that's dehydrated Massachusetts did not expand." It underscores, however, that the drought continues. Currently, 98% of the state is experiencing at least a "moderate drought" and 52.13% of the state is in an "extreme drought."

In the MWRA water service area, we continue to operate within normal operating range, with the Quabbin at 84.4% full.

MWRA staff presented a detailed report at the MWRA Board of Directors meeting in September. Staff highlighted that even if the drought continues for several more years, adequate supply exists in the Quabbin and Wachusett reservoirs to fully meet the needs to MWRA and also, if needed, to augment the supplies of some of the adjacent stressed communities.


Even with the Quabbin continuing to remain within normal operating range, the MWRA strongly urges communities/water users to practice water conservation. "It is important for everyone to use water wisely. We have many good ideas for saving water both <u>indoor</u> and <u>outdoors</u>."
