Tools and Resources for Communities

With MS4 permits on the horizon for July 2017, the Advisory Board is focusing on stormwater issues as it relates to MWRA communities. We continue to collaborate with agencies such as MAPC to help equip communities with the tools they need to usher in this new era of stormwater management. Among the resources available are those created by MAPC, including <u>worksheets</u> to estimate stormwater financing and an <u>outfall catchment calculator</u>.

On a related note, a comprehensive stormwater financing forum will take place at the University of New Hampshire from November 15 to 16. The two-day event is hosted by the New England Environmental Finance Center and could be an excellent opportunity to start thinking critically about laying the groundwork of stormwater management in your community.
